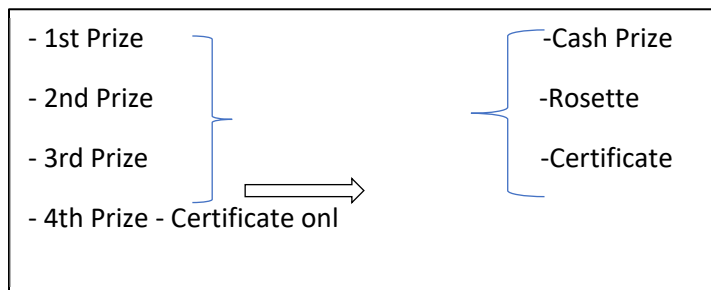
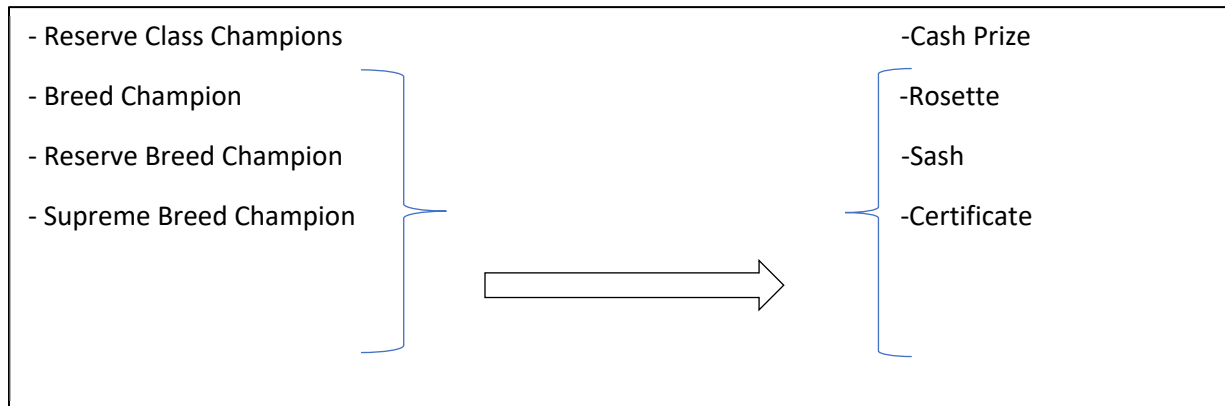

### **II. CONDITIONS FOR ENTRY**

1. Classes for entry are open to all Guernsey Cattle Breeders. However, Guernsey Breeders who are not members of the Guernsey Cattle Breeders Society of Kenya are strongly advised to register and join the Society.
2. The Show organizing Committee reserves the right to inspect any cattle entered and to limit the number of entries per class if necessary.
3. Age of the Show Cattle will be calculated from the 1st day of the Show i.e., on 3<sup>rd</sup> August, 2023.
4. All entries must be registered with the Kenya Stud Book and Milk Recorded with Dairy Recording Services of Kenya.
5. Entry fee is Ksh.600 per head and Young Stock Ksh 300 per head. Group entries will count as one and Entry fee is payable to the Kenya Livestock Breeders Show Trust.
6. Closing dates for entries is 31st May, 2023 after which the Society will prepare the official Judging Catalogue.
7. All information requested for in the entry form should be given in full.

8. If in the opinion of the Guernsey Society, the entries for any class are too many to be judged together, it will arrange for 'heats'. The top placed animals in each 'heat' will then go forward to the final judging for that class.
9. Judging of all Guernsey cattle will be done on 3rd and 4th August, 2023 starting
10. from 9.00 a.m.
11. An international judge appointed by the Guernsey Cattle Breeders Society of Kenya will be available to Judge the exhibited Cattle. The decision of the Judge is final.
12. Only female cattle can be exhibited.
13. The following winners to be awarded the indicated prizes:

#### Class Champions



**NB:** Cash prizes will be determined by the Guernsey Society and all prizes won together with Rosettes, Sashes and Certificates will be issued immediately after judging of each class is finalized.

14. The Cattle should be well trained and groomed. Cattle handlers should only take instructions from the judge while in the ring.
15. No advertisement by exhibitors or any other party will be allowed in the ring
16. Stewards appointed by the Ayrshire Cattle Breeders Society will be available with enough copies of the Judging Catalogue to direct the Cattle Handlers on presentation of Exhibits in the Judging Ring.
17. Lines to be left clean and tidy on departure from the showground.
18. **NB: There will be an auction of dairy cattle - details and conditions attached**

### **III. SHOW CLASSES**

#### **Young Stock and Young Handlers Classes**

G1: Handler aged 12 Years and under

G2: Handler aged between 12-16 Years

G3: Young Stock Handler Champion: no entries required, to be selected from 1st and 2nd winners in Young Stock and Young Handlers' classes.

NB: Winners of above classes to be determined on basis of:

- Best individual handler
- Best conformation and behavior of young heifer

(Young heifers to be aged between 6- 12 months)

#### **Heifer Classes**

G.4: Heifer 6 months old and under 12 months old

G.5: Heifer over 12 months old and under 18 months old

G.6: Heifer over 18 months and under 24 months, in calf but not yet in milk. (Date of last service to be stated).

G7: Heifer over 2 years and under 3 years in calf but not yet in milk (Date of last service to be stated) NB: Under 24 months in milk to be moved to Class A9

G.8: Heifer Champion and Reserve Champion. No entries required - to be selected from 1st and 2nd prize winners in heifer classes.

#### **Young Cow Classes**

G.9: Female over 3 years and under 5 years in milk (date of last calving to be declared).

G.10: Female over 3 years and under 5 years, dry and in-calf (date of last calving to be declared).

G.11: Young cow Champion and Reserve Champion - no entries required – to be selected from 1st and 2nd prize winners in young cow classes

#### **Mature Cow Classes**

G.12: Female over 5 years and under 7 years old, in milk (Date of last calving to be declared.)

G.13: Female over 7 years old and under 9 years old, in milk (Date of last calving to be declared)

G.14: Female over 5 years and under 7 years - dry and in calf (date of last calving to be declared).

G.15: Female over 7 years and under 9 years – dry and in calf (date of last calving to be declared)

G.16: Mature cow Champion and Reserve Champion - no entries required to be selected from 1st and 2nd prize winners in mature cows' classes.

#### **Matron Class**

G.17: Female 9 years and over, in milk (date of last calving to be declared).

G.18: Female 9 years and over - dry and in calf (date of last calving to be declared).

G.19: Matron Champion and Reserve Champion - no entries required to be selected from 1st and 2nd prize winners in matron cows' classes.

#### **Production Classes**

G.20: Junior Production class for females in 2nd and 3rd Lactation which have produced at least 4,500kg (305 days) in either of the lactations. Official Lactation certificates to be produced

G.21: Senior Production class for females in 4th Lactation and over, who have produced at least 6,000kg (305 days) in at least 2 lactations. Official Lactation certificates to be produced.

A.22: Female which had at least 7 normal calving's - points to be awarded.

a) 10 points for each normal calving with additional 10 points if in calf again (only on production of certificate of pregnancy).

b) 1 point for every 500kg of milk (official lactation certificates to be produced).

c) 1 point for every 50 kg of butter fat (official Lactation certificates to be produced).

d) 100 points for general conformation.

NB: Maximum length of lactation to be 305 days. Minimum butter fat for any lactation to be 3.7%.

#### **Special Classes**

G.23: Best Female sired by a local pedigree and registered bull. No entries - to be selected from 1st and 2nd prize winners in each of the heifer, young, mature, matron and production classes.

G.24: Young cow with best udder. Entries from young cow classes G.9, G10, G11

G.25: Mature cow with best udder. Entries from mature cow classes G.12, G13, G14, G15, G16

G.26: Matron cow with best udder. Entries from matron cow classes G17, G18, G19

G.27: Champion Female with the Best Udder. No entries required to be selected from 1st and 2nd winners in classes G24, G25, G26.

#### **Progeny Classes**

G.28: A group of 3 females over 3 years and under 5 years, dry and in calf and sired by same sire. (Sire not to be shown).

G.29: A group of 3 females, over 5 years and under 9 years dry and in calf and sired by same sire. (Sire not to be shown).

G.30: A group of 3 females over 3 years and under 5 years in milk and sired by same Sire. (Sire not to be shown)

G.31: A group of 3 females, over 5 years and under 9 years in milk and sired by same sire. (Sire not to be shown).

G.32: Champion and Reserve Champion of a group of 3 females - no entries required to be selected from 1st and 2nd prize winners in progeny classes.

#### **Winner of Winners Class**

G.33: Supreme Breed Champion and Reserve Breed Champion - No entries required to be selected from Champion and Reserve Champion in all Classes.

#### **Best Exhibitor and Handler Classes**

G.34: Best Exhibitor

#### **Points to be awarded**

- Supreme Champion - 14 points
- Reserve Supreme Champion - 13 points
- Matron Champion - 12 points
- Matron Reserve Champion - 11 points
- Mature Champion - 10 points
- Mature Reserve Champion - 9 points
- Young Champion - 8 Points
- Young Reserve Champion - 7 Points
- Heifer Champion - 6 points
- Heifer Reserve Champion - 5 points
- 1st Prize Winner - 4 points
- 2nd Prize Winner - 3 Points
- 3rd Prize Winner - 2 points
- 4th Prize Winner - 1 point

Only 1st Prize and 2nd Prize winners to be awarded with Ayrshire Cattle Breeders

Society Trophies, Cash Prizes and Certificates.

G.35: Best Handler - to be determined in the course of judging all the classes. (Only 1st Prize and 2nd Prize winners to be awarded with Cash Prizes and Certificates).

#### **JAMHURI PARK - NAIROBI**

##### **Veterinary Requirements**

1. All Cattle to enter the Show ground by vehicle through the Kibera Gate where they will be inspected by a Veterinary Officer. Cattle with skin disease, foot rot or any unsightly condition will be refused entry to the Show Ground.
2. Movement permits are necessary. All cattle, sheep and goats must be inoculated with Foot and Mouth disease Quadrivalent Vaccine not less than 20 days and no more than 60 days prior to commencement of the show. Lumpy Skin Disease & Anthrax Vaccination are recommended but not obligatory. Exhibitors should contact their Local Veterinary or Livestock office about this and also confirm if any other vaccines are necessary. There will be no movement of cattle from a farm in quarantine.
3. All cattle must be sprayed on arrival at the Show Ground.
4. Exhibitors must sign a certificate to the effect that to the best of his/her knowledge, cattle entering the Show Ground are not suffering from any contagious or infectious disease.

One form per animal, one form per each group. Entry fee: Classes G1 to G2 Kshs. 300 per class per entry and Kshs.600 per class per entry for Classes G4 to G33. Group class entries count as one entry, and are free.

#### GUIDELINES FOR LIVESTOCK TO BE AUCTIONED DURING LBS&S 2023

- Objectives of the livestock auction: -
- Afford breeders opportunity to sell quality livestock at premium prices
- Afford opportunity to interested farmers purchase quality livestock
- Advertisement opportunity for the Show and the Breeders
- Earn revenue for the LBST and Breed Societies

#### Guidelines

- Livestock eligible for auction will include Dairy (females only), dual purpose (males and females) & beef cattle, sheep & goats (males and females)
- Breeder should be a paid-up member of respective Breed Society
- Livestock to be auctioned must be registered at pedigree purebred or appendix
- The Livestock should be entered in respective classes and be judged
- Livestock to be auctioned must meet all veterinary requirements prior to being transported to showground
- Productivity of the livestock to be auctioned must be above herd / flock average in the traits of economic value
- Breeders will be required to fill a designated form for each livestock for sale and submit together with show entries
- Auction entry fees shall be Ksh1,000 for cattle and Ksh 500 for small stock
- 3% and 3% of each sale proceeds will be remitted to the Livestock Breeders Show Trust and the Auctioneer (Breeder/Farmer to receive 94% of the sale proceeds)
- Sale proceeds of champions shall remit 10% to the Livestock Breeders Show Trust, 3% to the auctioneer (Breeder/Farmer to receive 87% of the sale proceeds)
- All sales of livestock shall be done through the auction
- Breeder will be allowed to set minimum price and if not achieved can return unsold livestock home.
- Auctioned livestock shall be allowed to leave the showground only after the show

### **TRANSPORT REIMBURSEMENT GUIDELINES FOR LIVESTOCK BREEDERS SHOW 2023**

RAILAGE is not applicable this year.

Road Transport subsidy is given in the attached schedule – rates are per animal per km basis for the three categories.

Note that subsidy is paid for one way and shall not be claimed to transport feed.

See other notes below;

1. Maximum subsidy shall be claimed for Cattle within Kenyan borders to any one exhibitor is **KES. 90,000.00** per lorry load.
2. Maximum subsidy shall be claimed for Small Stock within Kenyan borders to any one exhibitor is **KES. 60,000.00** per lorry load.
3. Maximum subsidy shall be claimed for Other Stock within Kenyan borders to any one exhibitor is **KES. 30,000.00** per lorry load.
4. Minimum subsidy shall be claimed for Cattle within Kenyan borders to any one exhibitor is **KES. 15,000.00** per lorry load.
5. Minimum subsidy shall be claimed for Small Stock within Kenyan borders to any one exhibitor is **KES. 10,000.00** per lorry load.
6. Minimum subsidy shall be claimed for Other Stock within Kenyan borders to any one exhibitor is **KES. 5,000.00** per lorry load.
7. Proof of tonnage of all vehicles used to transport exhibits and number of animals transported is necessary to attach to a claim form.
8. Breed Society Chairman or their representative are required to provide the Treasurer's Office with exact mileage to ASK from where the animals are transported from.
9. Exhibitors may obtain transport refund claim forms from their Breed Society representative or the Treasurer's Office on arrival at the Show Ground.
10. Please make sure that your claim form is approved by the Breed Society Chairman and all relevant support documents attached before approaching the Treasurer's office for payment.
11. Please note that transport reimbursement applied above is not full compensation of actual cost of transport but a **subsidy** towards cost incurred in ferrying the animals to the Show.
12. Only one transport subsidy shall be paid for shared transport which the same should be shared between the exhibitors.
